- D. Entertaining readers

Answer: C

Explanation:

- C. Printed encyclopedias are still used and more convenient than using the internet.

Answer: A

The author makes the argument in paragraph 5 that devices such as the iPad and Kindle are "therefore better than books because they have multiple uses." All other choices reflect either supporting details or misrepresentation of the statements made by the author.

Question: 10

- C. Storing the wine in metal containers
- D. Adding chemicals to the wine as it is mixed

Answer: B
